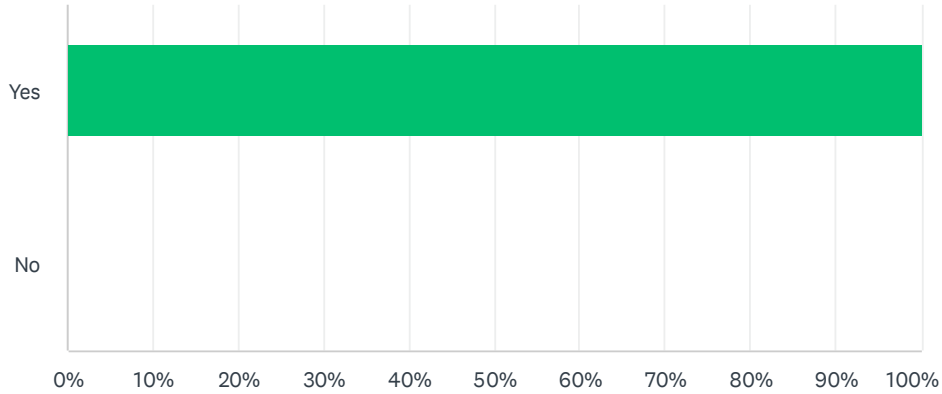


Q1 Are you classified as a UAMS faculty member? (Please see above for exclusions)

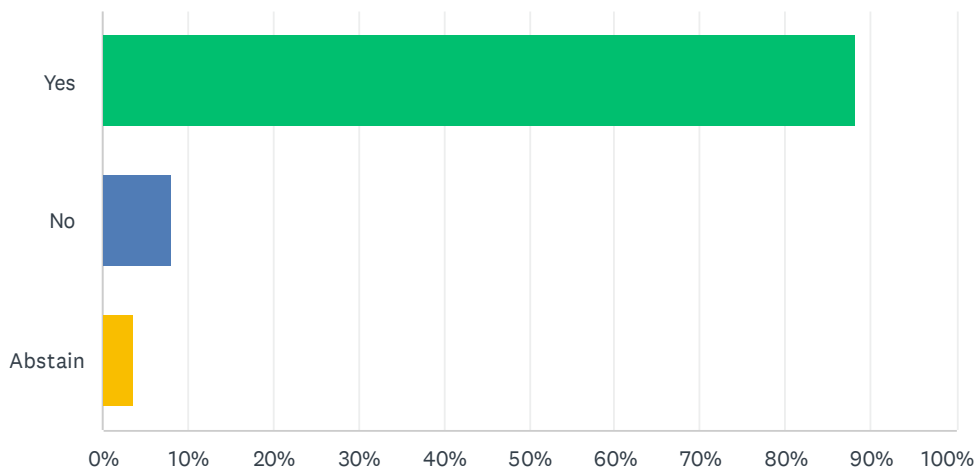

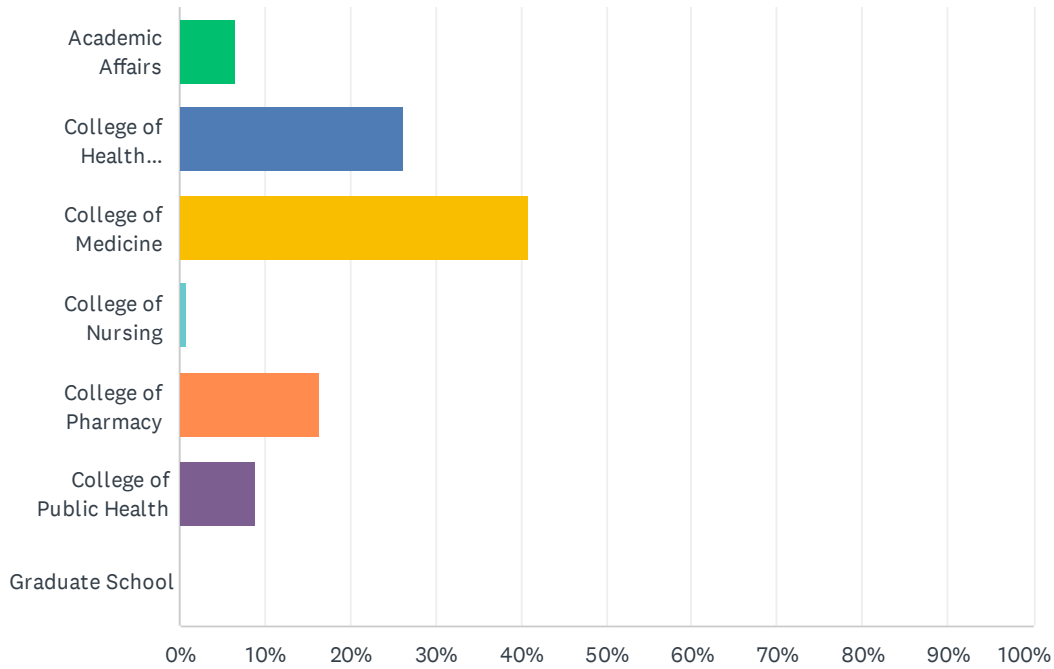

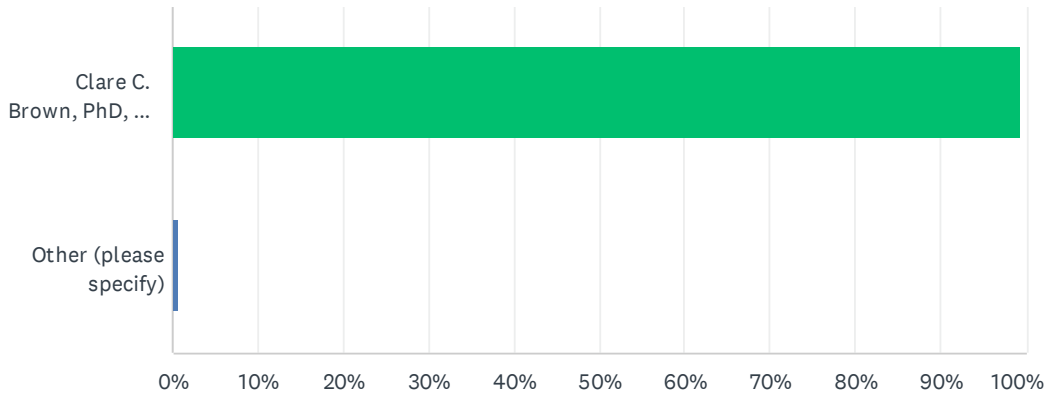
